ALL SITES BUT SKIN CARCINOMA

COMMENTS:

During the most recent years, the incidence, after increasing in both sexes till the end of the last century, seems to tend to stabilize both in men and in women. On the other hand, crude rates are pushed up by the population ageing. For men, the effect of the prostate incidence trend (see specific table) has an overwhelming effect on the incidence trend for all sites. Mortality shows a slow but constant decreasing trend in both sexes, at present well below half the incidence. Survival is better in women than in men, due to the different case mixing, but improves over time in parallel way.
