**COMMENTS:**  
This cancer, with a good prognosis, is clearly decreasing and tends to null. Incidence is falling in men in relation to the parallel decrease of the main exposure factors: cigarette smoking and outdoor work. Mortality has virtually disappeared in both sex. Survival proportions are very high in men (and fluctuating in women due to the small numbers of cases).
